River Arts Current Projects

River Arts is just completing the renovation of a historically significant 1847 interior stair schoolhouse. The building, currently known as the Lamoille Grange, was the first public high school in Morrisville, Vermont. Open to the community by January, 2008, the River Arts Center renovation creates an ADA accessible community arts center for all.

River Arts Facts

Founded in 1999, River Arts has grown by being open to creating rich and diverse partnerships. Collaborations with over 40 organizations, from Headstart, the schools, state agencies and Colleges in the area, the organization serves as a catalyst to creative community development. Ongoing art workshops for elders, 20 to 40 after school classes each semester, concerts, festivals, performances, classes, poetry readings and gallery exhibits — with over 4000 participants last year, River Arts strives to enrich the community through art.
